What You Need To Do Before You Get Here

- Make travel arrangements to get here
- Get familiar with the area
- Have a place to stay when you arrive
- Have all required documentation



Travel Arrangements

Plan ahead: Whether traveling from near or far we want you to be prepared. Make all of your travel arrangements in advance.

H2B Visa Employees: In making travel arrangements, you should consider the possibility that visa issuance may be delayed. We strongly recommend that you wait until your visa is in your passport to make travel plans.

Flying to Colorado: Choose what airport you will be flying into.

- Aspen, Colorado
- Vail/Eagle, Colorado (64 miles to Aspen)
- Grand Junction, Colorado (125 miles to Aspen)
- Denver, Colorado (220 miles to Aspen)

Ground Transportation to Aspen: Make sure to reserve all of your ground transportation arrangements from the airport you choose prior to your arrival. (More information in the transportation section starting on page 8)

Housing Arrangements

Aspen Skiing Company is able to offer housing at reduced rates to employees in certain departments. Once you secure a position with Aspen Skiing Company check with your manager to see if housing is available. If there is no housing available it is a good idea to get on the waiting list.



It is important to know where you will be staying for at least your first couple of nights. If you will be staying in employee housing you must make arrangements with the housing office at least 2 weeks prior to your arrival to move in. **If you do not make prior arrangements you may not be able to move into your place until normal business hours (Mon-Fri 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.).**

This is a very economical option if you need a place to stay for a short time. You can book a family room (4 people) or as a single. Blankets and pillows are included in the cost; linens are an extra \$2. Reservations are recommended.

Other Affordable Housing Options

It is essential that you look for housing as soon as possible. Housing in the area is VERY hard to come by if you wait until you get here.

Here are resources to help you find housing in the area. Some of the properties are geared toward winter seasonal employees, so be sure to check on lease agreements. Many of the properties are familiar with the challenges of international workers who are trying to coordinate housing in advance. None of these are affiliated with Aspen Skiing Company, but many of our employees live at these properties. There are also several communities located 15 to 30 miles "down valley" from Aspen and Snowmass (Basalt, El Jebel and Carbondale) that tend to be less expensive.

Required Documentation

All employees must have original work documents to attend New Hire Orientation and assure employment with Aspen Skiing Company.

COPIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE

Most common work authorization documents are:

1. Driver's license **and** a Social Security Card or birth certificate



2. **Or** a U.S. Passport, work authorization card or unexpired foreign passport with authorization to work.
- **For other acceptable documents contact HR**

International Applicants

1. Passport with visa and I-94 card
 - *J1 visa employees must also bring the DS-2019 form
2. Social Security Card

*If you don't have a social security card, you must apply for one prior to New Hire Orientation. You can apply at the Social Security office in Glenwood Springs. Be sure to bring the receipt of application with you to New Hire Orientation.

Things You Should Do As Soon As You Get Here

- Contact your department manager regarding your employment. They will sign you up for New Hire Orientation. You must go through New Hire Orientation with Human Resources before you can start working.
- Apply for a Social Security Card if you haven't already.
- Bring all of your original work documents to Human Resources at Buttermilk when you are scheduled for New Hire Orientation.
- Be prepared to take a drug test and possibly a physical.

Tax and Legal Information

All employees receive wages that are subject to United States taxes. You will be required to complete a W-4 form at New Hire Orientation prior to your employment. For specific questions about completing your W-4 please contact your accountant.

J1 employees completing Form W-4 are required to:

- Not claim exemption from income tax withholding.
- Request withholding as if single, regardless of actual marital status.
- Claim only one allowance (if the nonresident alien is a resident of Canada, Mexico, Japan, or South Korea, he or she may claim more than one allowance).
- Request an additional income tax withholding amount of \$15.30 for our biweekly payroll period.
- You are exempt from paying Medicare, Social Security and Federal Unemployment taxes.

H2B employees completing Form W-4 are required to:

- Not claim exemption from income tax withholding.
- To pay all Federal, State, Medicare, Social Security and Federal Unemployment taxes.

Travel Suggestions

Driving to Aspen

If you are driving to Aspen from Denver remember that Independence Pass closes in the winter so you will have to come in through Glenwood Springs off of I-70 to Highway 82.

Flying into Aspen

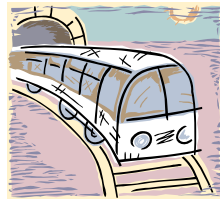
If you are flying directly into Aspen, you will need to either ride the RFTA (Roaring Fork Transit Agency) bus to your destination or get a taxi. RFTA will be cheaper than a taxi but,

they won't drop you at your door. Taxis to Aspen or Snowmass will cost about \$20. If riding RFTA from the airport you will need to go through the airport and parking lot towards Highway 82. The bus stops along the highway near the traffic light and can take you up valley to Aspen (\$0) or down valley to Snowmass (\$0), Basalt (\$3), El Jebel (\$4), Carbondale (\$5) or Glenwood Springs (\$6).

Travel from Denver

If you are flying into Denver you are about 220 miles (approximately 4 hours) from Aspen. You have a couple of options to get to Aspen from Denver:

1. You can arrange to take a Colorado Mountain Express van directly from the airport to Aspen. It takes about 4.5 hours. Call at least 24 hours prior to your arrival into Denver to reserve a seat on the shuttle.
2. You can take a Greyhound bus directly from the Denver Airport to Glenwood Springs. The trip takes approximately 4 hours. From Glenwood Springs you would need to take the RFTA bus service to Aspen. That trip will take 1.5 hours. Ask at the Greyhound Station for directions to the RFTA stop. You will need to make reservations for Greyhound in advance.
3. You can also take an Amtrak train from Denver to Glenwood Springs. The Amtrak station is 27 miles from the Airport, you will either need to take a taxi or you can ride the RTD SkyRide off of level 5 of the airport. Get off at the Market Street Station and walk 3 short blocks west to the Amtrak Union Station. Once you get to Glenwood Springs follow the directions for RFTA above to get to Aspen. The trip will take approximately 6 hours. You will need to make reservations for Amtrak prior to your arrival.



Flying into Eagle

1. You can take Colorado Mountain Express from Eagle directly to Aspen.
2. You can take the Greyhound bus system from Eagle to Glenwood Springs. You will then take RFTA from Glenwood Springs to Aspen.

Flying into Grand Junction

The Greyhound bus system is your best bet out of Grand Junction. Colorado Mountain Express doesn't have a regular schedule to Grand Junction so it is considered a private booking and will cost a lot! You can take the Greyhound bus to Glenwood Springs. You will then take RFTA to Aspen (see information for RFTA on previous page).

Getting Around While You Are Here

Independence Pass closes for the winter so the only access in and out of the valley is through Glenwood Springs or by plane.

RFTA (Roaring Fork Transit Agency)

The easiest way to travel in the Roaring Fork Valley is to take the bus. We have an excellent transit system that can get you almost anywhere.

- Aspen Skiing Company offers discounted RFTA bus transportation to its employees to get to and from work. We offer a 40 punch pass for \$14 instead of the full price of \$28.

RFTA offers bus transportation from Rifle to Aspen including Snowmass Village. You may also transfer from RFTA to Snowmass Village Shuttles which are free in the Town of Snowmass. When you arrive, ask your supervisor where you can get punch passes or monthly stickers to take advantage of the great savings. You can view RFTA bus schedules and stops prior to your arrival on their website at www.rfta.com.

Driving on Snow and Ice

Streets and highways covered with snow, snow pack or ice are extremely hazardous. They are most hazardous when the snow or ice begins to melt. The slush or wet surface acts as a lubricant and traction is reduced.

Overpasses, bridges, shaded areas, and snow packed portions of the road can be icy even when other pavement is not. Many drivers in the mountain areas choose to buy studded tires for their cars. These can be purchased throughout the valley. Bottom line is if you decide not to ride the bus, please drive with extreme caution.

Note While driving, watch carefully for large game animals in the road to avoid a collision that may cause severe damage to your vehicle.

Drug Testing And Grooming Standards

Drug Testing

Aspen Skiing Company is a drug-free workplace. The company strictly prohibits the use, sale, distribution, manufacture, or possession of illegal or non-prescription drugs on any company premises or work-sites.

The company strictly prohibits any employee from reporting for or being at work while impaired as a result of the illegal use of prescribed or non-prescribed prescription drugs, or while under the apparent influence of such drugs. The operation of company vehicles and/or machinery under such apparent influence is also forbidden.

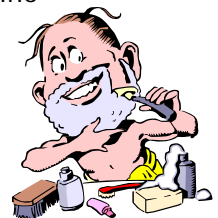


All offers of employment are conditional upon passing a pre-employment drug test. Any adulteration of the sample or refusal to submit a sample will be deemed a violation of this drug policy.

Grooming Standards

Aspen Skiing Company wishes to have employees make a positive first impression with our guests. Part of this impression is related to grooming. Some specific grooming policy information is noted below:

- **Overall Appearance**
All employees must maintain a neat and



clean appearance.

- **Hair Styles and Mustaches**

All hair must be of natural color (i.e. tones of brown, blond, red, gray, etc.) and be neatly trimmed, groomed and clean without extreme variations in length or color. Male's hair, if worn longer than shoulder length, must be pulled back and worn in a ponytail or braid.

- **Beards and Mustaches**

Male employees must be clean-shaven except for short and neatly trimmed beards, mustaches and sideburns.

- **Jewelry and Tattoos**

No employees should have excessive piercings or excessively visible or offensive tattoos.

Employees not complying with this grooming policy will not be permitted to work at Aspen Skiing Company.

Note The hotels may have stricter grooming policies than the mountains so, please check with your manager prior to your arrival.

Under 21

The legal drinking age in the USA is 21 and strictly enforced. Be prepared to show identification in most bars and clubs. Passports are accepted. Identification with a photograph and printed date of birth is considered valid.

Work And Training

It is important to check with your manager ahead of time and when you arrive to verify what your work schedule is going to be. The winter resort industry is snow dependent. While Colorado usually enjoys excellent snow conditions, sometimes snow comes late. If we experience low or delayed snow, we may be unable to open all or part of the ski area as scheduled.

In that event, work may not be available to you immediately upon your arrival.

You may need to go through various department training sessions before you begin working and may need to complete a fitness test.

Employee Assistance Program

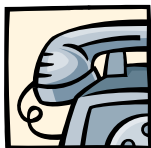

Driver's Licenses and ID Cards

New residents to the state have 30 days to obtain a Colorado Driver's License. A valid Driver's License, passport, birth certificate or other form of identification is required to get a Colorado license. To get an identification card you must have two forms of ID. One of those must be either a birth certificate or a passport.

Check with the Driver's License Bureau to find out what the requirements are to getting a Driver's License or Identification Card before going to the office.

Vehicle Registration

Colorado residents must apply for a title and registration when the owner is employed or residency is established in Colorado. Vehicle Identification (VIN) inspection from local law enforcement is also necessary.

Call the County Clerk and Recorder's office in the county you live in or if you need to find out what county you should register in.

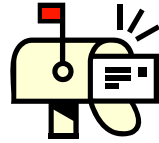

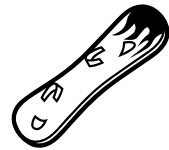

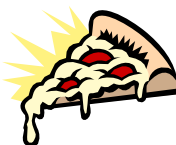
