UAS
 The close presence of humans can cause wildlife to alter their behavior and even displace wildlife from their historical habitats over time.

- Spring wildlife closures of the Burnt Mountain area and trails occur at a time when elk cows are having their calves.
- It is critical that these areas remain undisturbed.
- If humans are present during this delicate time, the elk cows may feel threatened and flee the area.
- If the calves have to move locations during their vulnerable first weeks, they are more likely to be preyed upon.
- Calf survival is vital to sustaining elk populations in the area.
- Closure dates are in line with the snowline receding uphill as temperatures warm.

Not only do these closures benefit elk, but all other wildlife who are nurturing their offspring and need sanctuary from human activity.

HIKING TRAIL CLOSURES: JUNE 21-JUNE 28
 On June 21, Sequel and Tom Blake trails are open for use. On June 28, Government Trail, Anaerobic Nightmare and top of Upper Vista (along with affected bike park trails Gonzo and Valhalla) are open for use.

MANDATORY LEASH ZONE
 Per Snowmass Village Municipal Ordinance 7-124, fines may be issued.

Elk Camp Gondola: Dogs are only allowed to ride in the odd-numbered cabins. They must be leashed at all times.
Sky Cab Gondola: Dogs are only allowed to ride in the third cabin. They must be leashed at all times.

What's new?

Class 1 e-mountain biking pilot program. Permitted on designated trails June 21-September 7.

As part of our pilot eMTB program, Class 1 e-bikes are permitted on designated trails on the west side of Snowmass Mountain only. All other trails—including the Snowmass Bike Park, cross-country singletrack, and Government Trail—are closed to e-bikes unless otherwise posted.

All riders must yield to hikers and traditional mountain bikers, follow posted signage, and wear a helmet at all times. Class 1 e-bikes only. *Designated trails marked on map.
