#### From the Colorado Ski Safety Act:

Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

#### From the Your Responsibility Code:

You must prevent runaway equipment.

Sliding devices on the mountain must have metal edges. NO motorized, electric assist or powered devices allowed.

# **DEVICES ALLOWED**



Allowed with retention device. Must have metal edges.

#### **SNOWBOARDS**



Allowed with retention device. Must have metal edges.

# **DEVICES ALLOWED Continued**

# **TELEMARK, AT & RANDONEE SKIS**





Allowed with retention device.

Must have metal edges and retention device (including those with releasable bindings).

### **MONOSKIS**





Allowed with retention device.

#### **SNOWBLADES**





Allowed with retention device. Must have a minimum length of 65cm

# **ADAPTIVE EQUIPMENT**





Adaptive equipment limited to: Mono-ski, dual-ski, bi-ski, slider, outriggers, tethers and ski tip and tail retention type devices.

Any other devices must be approved by Aspen Skiing Company Mountain Management.

# **RESTRICTED ACCESS**

### SKI BIKES – WITH PEGS OR FOOT SKIS

(Snowbike/bicycle conversion – see separate section)





#### **RESTRICTED**

Bikes must have metal edges and must have 2 or 3 skis.

Must be designed to load chairlift without slowing or stopping.

Recommended to use on high-speed detachable lifts only. Only
1-rider per bike. Bikes must be able to fall over if separated
from rider or have leash. NOT recommended in terrain parks.

Rider must be able to ride bike off unload ramp.

# **SNOWDECKS**





#### **RESTRICTED**

ONLY allowed on chairlift if snowdeck has metal edges and retention device. Recommended to use on high-speed detachable lifts only. Must be able to ride off unload ramp.

# TRIKES (TRIKKE AND STAND-UP SKI BIKE)





### RESTRICTED

Bikes must have metal edges. Must be designed to load chairlift without slowing or stopping. Recommended to use on high-speed detachable lifts only. Only 1-rider per bike. Bikes must have leash or be able to fall over if separated from rider.

NOT recommended in terrain parks.

### **SNOWSHOES**





#### **RESTRICTED**

Not allowed on chairlifts. Allowed on Elk Camp Gondola with ACES Tour and Silver Queen Gondola. Allowed on designated uphill routes. See Uphill Policy for more details.

# **RESTRICTED ACCESS Continued**

#### **TUBES**





### **RESTRICTED**

Restricted to Tubing Hill at Elk Camp.



### **NOT ALLOWED**

NOT ALLOWED elsewhere on the mountain

# YAK TRAX / BOOT TRACTION DEVICES





#### **RESTRICTED**

Not allowed on chairlifts. Allowed on Elk Camp and Silver Queen Gondolas. Allowed on designated uphill routes. See Uphill Policy for more details.

# **LURKS**





# RESTRICTED

Not allowed on chairlifts if over 5' in length. Must be disassembled if over this length and carried in line with chairlift while riding.

Bikes not allowed to have gears/chain/wheels/tires or crank assembly.

# **PLASTIC SNOWBOARDS**





Cheap plastic snowboards or skis that do not have metal edges or proper bindings are NOT ALLOWED on the mountain.

# **NOT ALLOWED Continued**

### **CHILDREN IN BACKPACKS**





NOT ALLOWED when skiing/riding or going uphill. Allowed in gondolas when riding as foot passengers.

### **TANDEM**





Multiple people not allowed on a single set of equipment. Each person must have their own equipment.

# **SNOWSKATES**





# **BOOT SKIS**





This includes devices shorter than 65cm in length and brands such as ODR, Snowfeet and other similar devices such as ski skates, regardless of whether they have metal or plastic edges.
