

**LEED Silver Certified Restaurant at Elk Camp
Summary of Environmental Initiatives and Efficient Use of Resources**

RECYCLING AT CAFÉ SUZANNE

Café Suzanne was deconstructed to make way for the development of the Restaurant at Elk Camp.

All of the kitchen equipment was given to two groups; one starting a new restaurant and catering business represented by Cindy at the Elk Camp VMF and the other was the Veterans Administration – Veterans Services of Glenwood Springs.

Tables and Chairs went to Gwyn and George of High Alpine and Habitat for Humanity ReStore – about 50/50.

All metals were salvaged and recycled in Glenwood Springs. Timbers were salvaged and given to our mountain workers and others in the valley for re-purposing (reuse).

All paints and cleaning chemicals were disposed of by Greg McPherson at the Pitkin County Landfill through their program.

Concrete was broken up and buried on site. More than 70% of the building and contents were diverted from the Landfill.

ELK CAMP RESTAURANT

- Zero VOC paints, finishes, stains, glues (no formaldehyde) – wood preservative treatments are still being used where required
- FLOR carpet tiles made with varying degrees of renewable and recycled content and recyclable through Interface’s “Return & Recycle Program”
- Dual pane insulated glass with Low E finish
- Building Envelope R-Value exceeds all local codes
- 95% and greater mechanical equipment efficiency
- All construction waste separated and recycled where appropriate
- LED and fluorescent lighting throughout – no incandescent lighting
- FSC Certified Wood
- Recycling, Reuse and diversion from landfill of over 70% of prior building (old restaurant) content
- Water efficient landscaping
- Innovative Wastewater Technologies and Water Use Reduction
- Energy performance beats 2009 IECC by 32%
- Use of Free Air Refrigeration
- LEED Silver Certified
